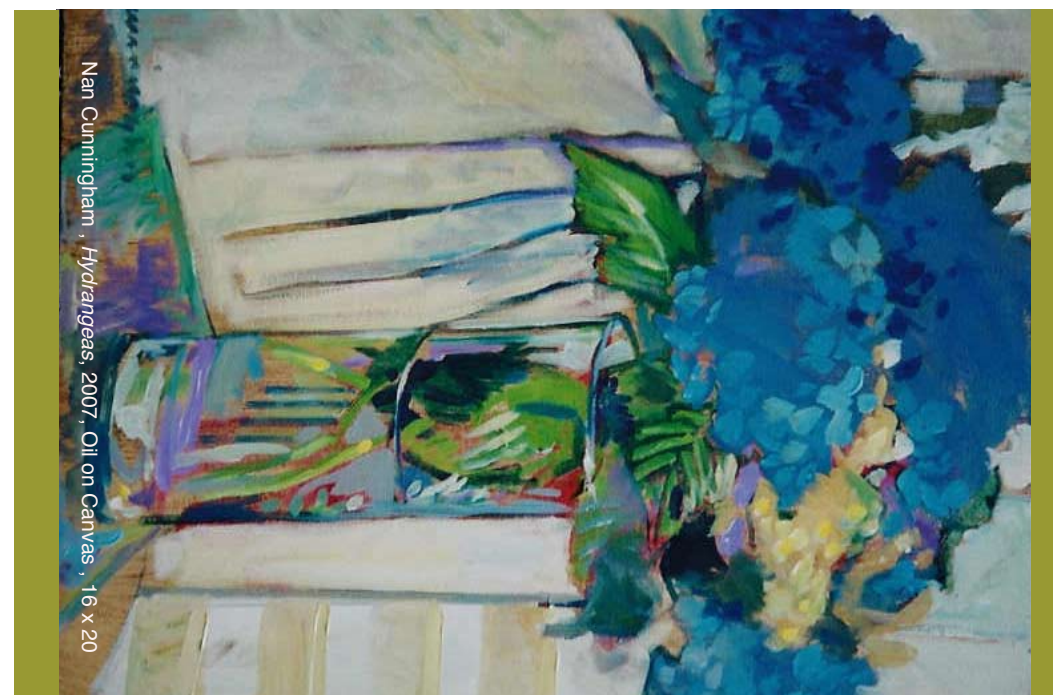

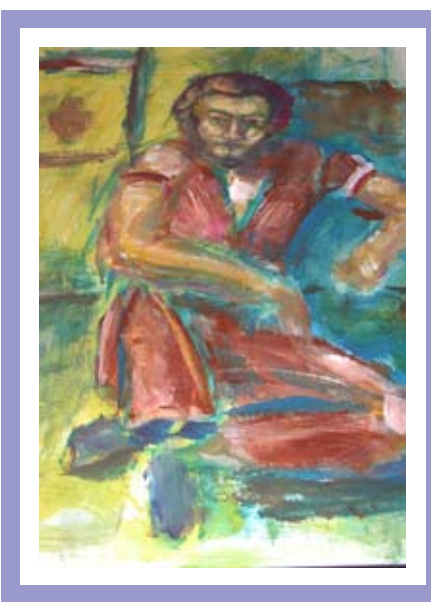


Nan Cunningham, 'Hydrangeas', 2007, Oil on Canvas, 16 x 20

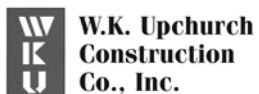
